Grounds, LaMarr Hood:

Another busy month, more to do then man power do to summer actives, vacations and work schedules. Thanks to the crew who were able to come out.

A lot of sawing target legs and making target stands was a priority, along with general clean up, with some lawn mowing at the pistol and rifle bays.

Thanks to Gary and Godzilla we were able to clean up the action bays 1, 2 & 3, by widening and moved the berm back around 6 feet deeper, along with raising the berms by about 2-3 feet. Gary did some clean-up of bay 7 before the contractor came in and then after he left, along with bay 6. We spent Thursday unloading cement ecology blocks. Sam and Dale finished up Friday. In the pistol bay, we cleaned up the brush on the back of bay 7 and cleaned out the target stands and replaced with new ones at the 50-yard berm also shoving back the berm and raising it. On the back of bay 7 we shoved dirt up on the block and again making the field wider.

The laurel bush by the front entrance was trimmed to increasing the visibility to and from the main road. Also, adjusted the front gate for better fit and easier to close.

We will bet taking the month of August off, so very little will be done by the Monday Crew this month.

Weekly watering of native plants is keeping most of this spring and last year's plants alive during our record setting days without rain.

Hunter Education, Gary Emerson:

Classes are filling up as soon as posted. Our final traditional class of 2017 will be next week.




Steel Matches, Cel Alvarez:

Kevin and Derick volunteered to mark a fire lane next to the cowboy TCU.

- 4. Rebuilding the fence in bay six and seven. Sam and the crew completed the work before westmatch. Expenses submitted so far: \$10,675
- 5. Lead recovery from shotgun range. Work is complete.

New Business:

- 1. John reported that the Department of Labor inspected the range for noise. We passed and will not need to inspected for two years.
- 2. Safety items for July
- 3. Kids Shoot Proposal
- 4. Club house condition after West Match: Restrooms were messy.
- 5. LaMarr asked about routing water to the action bays. He will plan for it in the 2018 budget.
- 6. Randy brought up the issue that on Wednesday before the cowboy match there was not sufficient signage noting that the range was closed.
- 7. Ted Robinson and Jeff Mau from Tenecore expressed interest in using the range for training (product testing, develop and marketing). He does not charge for the class. He will be able to reserve a bay through Jay and just pay daily fees (as applicable).
