Announcements:

- 1) **MSP** (Motion Second and Passed) by Karen, seconded by John to approve the minutes, as revised for March.
- 2) Ted shared that Glenn Pickard submitted his resignation and retired on March 28th. Glenn had been with the club for 16 years and will be missed. Tom Talburt will be our acting Rifle and Pistol Rangemaster until a full-time replacement is found. Ted is working on options
- 3) Paul Bennett has been hired to work part time with Jim at the shotgun range.

Standing Committee Reports:

Archery, Ted Pitt:

The Monday crew checked out the range did some cleanup.

Trap & Skeet Ted Pitt:

Shotgun still busy. We had a clinic last month that went very well. There were seven students and lots of help. Bo Li came out and brought his collection of shooting medals.

We have our April fools shoot this Saturday and we have 4 squads so far,

Last month rifle/ pistol had 970 people attend. As of the 28th glean no longer works as the range master. We are out of ammo and targets are low.

Grounds: LaMarr Hood:

The main project of removing the old berm behind bay 4 (Item 7 Old Business) was completed after 4 days, we built up the berms between bays 4 & 5 and other side of 5. We were also were able to clean up the two bays and remove rocks from the bays. The telehandler worked great so there was no need to rent other machinery. Cost, another barrel of fuel. Steve started hauling in loads of large cement to fill in and make a base for the TCU. The leveling will have to be completed by Steve and his mini. The smaller trees removed from the back gate we added to the berms between 4 & 5 to help hold dirt in place.

General cleanup has continued on the rifle and pistol ranges along with target backers, repairing staplers and grinding up old papers to help keep things tidy.

As requested by Ted we walked though both archery ranges and removed down limbs from the pathway and checked out the shooting lanes, the 3D targets are shoot up pretty bad and some target bags need replaced.

We also laid blocks next to the Club House near front the steps and added crushed cement and rolled the area to cover the mud and old sidewalk.

We have published our match schedule for the season and participated in our first event, which was at the Upper Nisqually Sportsmen's Club in Eatonville, WA. We took 19 shooters and entered 22 guns. Upper Nisqually was very pleased with our participation and enjoyed watching our kids compete. Our kids did very well, and we received many compliments on our behavior, attention to safety, and skill. Our next match is at the Tacoma Sportsman's Club in Puyallup on April 11th.

On a side note, two of our kids went to the SW Regional Championships in Arizona this last weekend. Ethan Chewning took 1st place overall in RFPI (rimfire pistol iron sights). Jack Sasaki took 3rd place.

As a reminder we are hosting the WA State Championships on June 12th and 13th.

Black Rifle League, Aaron Lyons:

I am currently working with DocuSign to move away from paper waivers to adopt digital waivers.

Commentary

February was the worst month for financial performance at the club since the shutdown last summer. We had the lowest revenue and ran the largest loss since then. Once again, we were not able to add to the club's savings account.

The club recorded \$21,614.61 in revenue and generated a net loss of \$4,456.90 for the month.

Revenue Report

Our revenue decreased by 16.6% from January. We had lower match revenue because of the ASI match not being held and also because we didn't record USPSA revenue for the month as our Stripe account did not start transferring funds until March. USPSA match fees for February will be recorded in March. Membership revenue dropped by 56% compared to January.

Merchandise sales continue to be the largest contributor to our income with 46% of our revenue. We saw some sales for pistol ammunition which finally came in after orders placed over the summer. We are hoping that supply will improve by late summer allowing us to improve our sales of ammunition. A continued shortage of ammunition in the general market could affect match fees from shooting sports

during our peak summer months as less people are able to participate due to the unavailability of ammunition.

Shared a proposal to open an account at another institution for the club's reserves – Proposed to move \$248K from savings to BECU Karen made a motion to move \$248K from BECU. Seconded by Jon.

From Su Laig: The only news is our new shooter initiative program happening at Interlake the end of April. I'm working on an agenda and hope to schedule a meeting for our group soon.

Old Business:

- 1. Diana Pinto Publishing the club's policies and procedures will address one at a time. Taking on the next one item 2
- 2. Subcommittee for what to do with members/non-members who are asked to leave the range, how to track it, and what to do with repeat offenders (Karen, Diana, Aushim & Aaron).

Karen, Diana, Aushim and I met on March 5th to discuss the proposed changes on creating a software-based solution that would make a better solution for tracking members, the general public and give the range masters the ability to track when a customer is asked to leave the range. Currently, I am working through the Database architecture with Aushim and Chuck and designing the application solution that would replace the antiquated solution that we now have. I would need to spin up the following services

- Microsoft O365 Tenant for RFGC
- Dynamics CRM
- PowerApps
- PowerBI (this will be great for reporting)

The overall solution would encompass four separate solutions

- **Solution** 1 Dynamics CRM Members & Public Allowing the range masters and leadership to better track both members and general public on use of the range as well as allowing more transparency as to members renewing.
- Solution 2 Dynamics CRM Rules Violation Form This will allow the Range Master to
 quickly fill out a form online within CRM, attach it to the person being removed from the
 range as to why they are being removed. Utilizing work flows it would kick off an email to
 the individual (as we would have already had this on file from initial check in) as to why they
 were asked to leave, encouraging them to please visit us again after X number of days.
- **Solution 3** Member Management This will allow us to better manage our members. Looking as range use, who has renewed, violations, etc.
- Solution 4 Check-In PowerApp This is a future version, which will allow us to check
 in members utilizing a bar code system or our member number, which will return a VALID
 or EXPIRED on the range masters screen so they know if the person's membership has
 lapsed.

The board approved the committee to continue researching solutions.

- 3. Creating a member only section on the RFGC website (Aushim & Chuck) No progress
- 4. Aushim giving the club the ability to accept electronic payment directly for matches. Is piloting it with USPSA

- Neighbors Concerned trees LaMarr has had some trees removed and working to remove additional ones (will require a crane).
 Job Completed: The trees of concern have been removed. Maple and fir south of club house on fence line and the cottonwood trees next to the back gate south of pistol range.
- 6. Aaron Lyons offered to redo the rifle range orientation video. I have received sign-off from Glen and Rob and will be moving forward this month. I'm coordinating with Scott Zumwalt to pick a date in April on a Monday or Tuesday to film the new orientation video and look to deliver the new orientation videos before the end of April to review and sign off by May. I will also be working with Chuck Mueller to set up a business YouTube account to host these videos as the current videos are on a personal YouTube account.

Chuck noted that the YouTube channel has been setup for new videos.

Robb is to ask Aaron to also coordinate with Steve.

Randy suggested that the new video also be sub-titled in other languages (e.g., Chinese). There was a good discussion regarding the need for shooters to understand all the basic safety commands.

This is one of the next policies that Diana will be working on.

- 7. Action bay updates (LaMarr) Prepare a location for the youth program's storage. Covered in the grounds report.
- 8. New internet connection (Chuck)
 Still pending a permit needed to move forward with the construction. The permit is expected to be received on 5/19/21.
- 9. Audit request Georgia will talk to Mike our CPA. Karen will also get estimates. Look at this in July (or later) after tax season.
- 10. Action bay walls and support stands. Aaron and Dave will coordinate with the other disciplines to build new walls and stands. Also, where they are stored.
- 11. Karen: Sniffing dogs will be coming on May 17 and 18.
- 12. Requesting a large dumpster for general range cleanup (Robb). Since we are not having a 2021 general work part it was thought that we would bring in a dumpster like we did in 2020. Decision was made to bring in the dumpster now

Items on hold:

- 1. Action bay upper berm repair, on top of bays 4 and 5 is on hold until next spring (Steve).
- 2. The facing on the North side of the club house needs repaired and painted (Ted).
- 3. Install blocks and rack next to bay 7 for lumber storage (Steve) Waiting for dry weather and racks

New Business:

- 1. Safety Items for April:
 - a. Range is following all COVID-19 guidance and practices.
- 2. Robb to schedule an action bay committee meeting to determine what items should be removed and where items should be stored.
- 3. Dick spoke about the World Cup qualifications and the Olympics (skeet, trap, air rifle).
