Archery, Ted Pitt:

We have new targets that just arrived and should make the range look good.

Trap & Skeet Ted Pitt:

Shotgun targets arrived last week. We should be good for a while.

Bunker: we have two shoots for August. The watermelon and the Adolf Haugen. Should be fun. G ot the field mowed and part of the hill (looks good). Also got the driveway brushed when it was wet.

Rifle & Pistol, LaMarr Hood:

Range looking good. Our range usage for rifle 430, pistol 455, action bays 197, After hour shooters 18.

Total Members 688, Nonmembers 264, Total 952, Last month 1140 using the ranges, and we were down 188 shooters. July 2023 where had 975 shooters.

We collected and sorted around 350 pounds of brass this month and for June and July we have averaged replacing 10 short legs, 31 long legs, and 37 wood backers per month. Targets have been placed on the side of the target backers which cover the legs is one of the problems we have that get the legs shot up. Each leg cost \$1.50 = \$46.50 a month

Starting next month September, we will be having a contractor in remodeling the outside of the R&P buildings, reroof siding, painting, and other things will be done. During this time, we may have to close one or both ranges during the week but will be open on weekends. So, check before you come down to see if we will be open. During hunter sight in please be patient and members maybe you can do your sighting in this month and not wait until the last day to do so.
