Announcements:

The following decisions we made at the May 11th directors meeting:

1. Reviewed the estimate for the Camera system at the Rifle and Pistol and approved spending up to \$2500 to conduct a test run.
2. To address credit card fees, a 3% fee will be applied to people renewing their memberships via credit card and a \$5 minimum purchase is required for credit card use.
3. Due to incidents involving spall and bullet fragments leaving the shooting bay when engaging steel targets, the use of steel targets in Bay 7 is prohibited until further notice. This prohibition applies to all practices, matches and shooting disciplines. The situation will be monitored and reviewed at the July 6 Directors Meeting, at which time the Board will reevaluate whether steel targets may be reinstated.

Target systems: During May, the 50 yd, 100 yd and 200 yd target backs and frames on the rifle range were repaired and/or refreshed. Some shooters have been misusing the new 100 yd targets and stapling targets over the legs, causing damage. Reminders on proper use have been posted in the Club Newsletter.

Three additional 20 ft sections of Unistrut were hung under the baffles for the future 25 yd target retrieval systems on the long pistol range. The back-ordered materials have arrived.

Three cables were shot and replaced on the existing target retrieval system. All other repairs and consumables were negligible.
