Approval of the previous month's minutes:

MSP (Motion Second and Passed) by Scott Johnson seconded by LaMarr Hood to approve the minutes, as submitted for July.

Decisions from the July 6th Directors Meeting:

- Port of Seattle Wildlife Abatement Training Request
 - Approve or deny use of the trap range for training. – **Approved**
 - Determine whether monthly billing or punch cards will be offered. – **Monthly Billing at non-member credit card rate.**
 - Determine whether secure shotgun storage can be provided and under what conditions. – **Would have to provide a safe that they only they have access to.**
- Training for Permit to Purchase/CPL - May need to plan for training for members to follow the new state laws for CPL renewals and purchases.
Decision: Dave McClure will contact John and be the point person for any further actions.
- No use of steel in bay seven other than sanctioned matches to reduce spall onto the pistol range
- Steel Dragons request for financial support for the upcoming Nationals competition.
Decision: Approved \$4K donation.
- New flooring for the rifle range office –
Decision: LaMarr to get estimates for new flooring and paint.

6. Movember match will no longer take place. Dave has asked for the proceeds from the September match to be given to the Prostrate Cancer Foundation.

Decision: Approved the net proceeds to be sent to the Prostrate Cancer

Announcements:

Brass Recycling – Ted delivered the club's accumulated brass to **Valley Recycling**. The shipment included:

- 11,281 pounds of brass
- 48 pounds of aluminum cases
- 598 pounds of steel cases

The recycled materials generated **\$39,002.71** in revenue.

Ted noted that the shipment represented approximately 18 months of accumulated brass. He monitored the scrap metal market and timed the sale to take advantage of improved pricing. By waiting until a larger quantity had accumulated, the club received a better return for the recycled materials.

Standing Committee Reports:

Archery, Ted Pitt:

Archery is doing well, but the trails need a bit of trimming.

Trap & Skeet Ted Pitt:

Shotgun is looking great. We mined a total of 56 drums of shot, which is approximately 160,000 pounds.

The bunker is doing well. We had 30 shooters at our state shoot, and Bella Pompeo won the state championship.

Our next shoot is the Adolf Haugen shoot in August.

Rifle & Pistol, John Gerhard:

The rifle and pistol ranges are operating well. The PA system for rifle/pistol ranges is operational.

The berm at the end of the baffles on the short pistol range has been significantly upgraded and extended to reduce ground and rock strikes (see photo). Sand from the 25 yd berm on the long pistol range was used as the base on the short pistol range berm, then covered with wood chips to a height that prevents rounds from directly impacting the ground/rocks in front of the impact berm.



All sandbags on the rifle and pistol ranges have been either repaired or replaced. There are about a dozen spares in the storage room by lane 19.

The shed behind the rifle/pistol range office is in the process of being cleaned. I spoke with Dale and Ted about adding additional lighting to help the folks working the steel bench. A more useful workstation will be built.
